

Ms. Romero-Briones (Cochiti/Kiowa) works as Associate Director of Research for First Nations Development Institute and manages the Native Agriculture and Food Systems Initiative at First Nations. She is formerly the Director of Community Development for Pulama Lana'i. She is also the co-founder and former Executive Director of non-profit for Cochiti Pueblo, New Mexico. Ms. Romero-Briones worked for the University of Arkansas' Indigenous Food and Agricultural Intuitive while she was getting her LLM in Food and Agricultural Law. Her thesis was on the Food Safety Modernization Act as it applied to the Federal Tribal relationship. She wrote extensively about Food Safety, the Produce Safety rule and tribes, and the protection of tribal traditional foods. A U.S. Fulbright Scholar, Ms. Romero-Briones received her Bachelor of Arts in Public Policy from Princeton University, and received a Law Doctorate from Arizona State University's College of Law, and LLM in Food and Agricultural Law from the University of Arkansas. She currently sits on several boards, including the Lana'i Elementary and High School Foundation. She was also recognized as a White House Champion of Change in Agriculture. She currently sits on the National Organic Standards Board.
